

Gilpin County Action Plan

Presentation – Rural Resilience Mixer, February 8, 2024



Overview

- Half of Gilpin County's residents are employed in the gaming and hospitality industries. To become resilient to economic downturns, Gilpin County is diversifying its economy, focusing on the mid- and northern areas.
- [Black Hawk](#) is developing a gaming-centric resort destination anticipated to grow the region's incremental revenue by an estimated \$197 million per year.
- The [Central City](#) Council is leading revitalization through diversification and expansion of business opportunities and maintenance of the city's historic atmosphere.



Gilpin's Economic Opportunities

- **Rollinsville Main Street Vision**: To support the attraction of new businesses to the area and provide space where businesses can cluster to provide greater accessibility and visibility to clients. “Make Rollinsville a destination.”
- **High-Speed Internet**: To enhance access to high-speed internet within the County to improve access to remote work and quality of residential life.
- **Enhance Trail Assets**: To provide a free amenity for the community's health and enjoyment and attract visitors to the community and boost spending at local businesses.
- **Local Business Support**: To increase employment opportunities through facilitating the growth of local businesses, and to lower the barrier to entry for new business startups.

Rollinsville Main Street Vision

During a planning charrette, 24 highly-engaged Rollinsville community members recommended that the following items be addressed in a destination vision plan:

- **Street development** – sidewalks & crosswalks.
- **Parking** – cars, bikes, EV charging station.
- **Traffic control** – stop signs, roundabout.
- **Façade improvements** – windows, doors, signs.
- **Placemaking** – flower pots, benches, parklets.



Attendees discussed the need to create an organization, enabling a unified voice and the ability to enact improvements, obtain funding, and influence government decisions.

High-Speed Internet

- Enhancing high-speed internet would improve remote work and the quality of residential life.
- Even before Covid, a study* showed that more than half of Gilpin County households have at least one person working from home.
- The DOLA Roadmap to Recovery resiliency group (Peak-to-peak region) identified broadband as a priority project.
- The County is working to provide broadband to areas in need.



*88% of tested download speeds were below the FCC minimum in the 2017 Neo Connect Gilpin County Broadband Survey.

Enhance Trail Assets:

- By expanding its outdoor assets in a sustainable way, Gilpin County has the potential to advance its economy and increase local business support, increase tourism spending, and take advantage of capital and operational expenditure impacts.
- Opportunities to improve accessibility to trails include:
 - Develop parking to make it easy to travel to the trailhead.
 - Install signage to clearly mark trailheads and paths.
 - Provide a map that visitors can use to identify which trails appeal to them and to highlight nearby businesses to visit before or after using the trails.
